Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath ji today visited Sanjay Gandhi Post-graduate Institute of Medical Sciences where he inspected the CCM (Critical Care Medicine), dialysis unit and new OPD as well as the isolated ward prepared for treatment of swine flu patients.

He instructed officials and doctors to ensure that swine flu patients are treated properly and to also see that all preventive measures are in place to prevent further spread of this disease. Yogi ji also sought to know the precautions taken by the paramedical staff and also their behaviour with swine flu patients, along with the preparedness of the SGPGI in wake of the swine flu.

Terming the SGPGI as a high-class medical institute, the Chief Minister called for enhancing the facilities here so that patients coming here from different parts of the state are offered better treatment and facilities here.

The Chief Minister reiterated the commitment of the state government to provide quality healthcare to people from the poor and weaker sections of the society. He also directed doctors not to prescribe unnecessary tests and medicines and rather use the resources available at the institute.
