Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath ji ji today met people affected by the floods at the Indrasan Singh Government Degree College, Pachwas premises in Haraiyya tehsil of Basti district and enquired about their well being. He also distributed relief material there.

On this occasion, the Chief Minister distributed food grains pulses, salt, chlorine tablets etc to 25 flood affected families of village Majhakitawal, Kalyanpur and Majha Madna. The beneficiaries included Mr. Santram, Mrs. Chanauta, Mrs. Phulwari, Mrs. Jagrani etc.

Addressing a gathering, the Chief Minister said around 64 villages of Haraiyya region in Basti district were hit by floods and said that because of the organized and timely action, no loss of life

and property has taken place. The Chief Minister also said that nobody had control over natural calamities but by being alert, one can save lives, property and also minimize the devastation.

He also informed that in all flood-hit districts adequate relief material had been provided and that promptly rescue operations were conducted. Yogi ji added that public representatives and officials had worked in coordination with officials to execute relief works.

With regards to damage to crops due to floods, the Chief Minister directed officials to make prompt assessment and sent a report to the state government so that adequate compensation could be made at the earliest.

The Chief Minister also said that the state government and the Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi had taken keen interest in the running of the Munderwa sugar mill and pointed out that this would lead to employment for locals and would also benefit farmers.

For this he also congratulated the public representatives and local people and announced that the sugar mill would be started soon. Also present on the occasion were public representatives and senior officials of the district administration.
