Chief Minister addresses first Employment Meet

Lucknow: 29 August, 2017

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath ji has said that security and safety of every citizen was the responsibility of the state government. The present State Government, he pointed out, was committed to discharging this duty expeditiously. He further added that strict steps and investor friendly decisions taken in this direction have now started yielding positive results.

He also said that the State Government was seriously working towards simplification of labour laws and giving guarantee of safety to investors and thereby creating conducive environment for investment. The Chief Minister was addressing the maiden Employment Summit, organized by the labour and employment department at the scientific convention centre here today.

On this occasion, the Chief Minister gave away certificate of employment to 10 youths, launched an employment application and a 'Career Guide' magazine. Yogi ji said that in the beginning, many enterprises do not show much promise but soon they become a big part of the market. He cited

example of how in early days, tea manufacturers would hold camps to make tea popular and same was the case with mobile phones.

However their current position in the market is not a hidden fact anymore, he mused. The Chief Minister further said that no one is unfit and all one needs is a facilitator. His government, he added, had donned this mantle and was working to provide employment to the youth of the state.

He also pointed out that the signing of an MoU with the National Human Resource Development Network (NHRDN), access of state's youth to eminent industrialists had been made easy.

More than 12,500 members are part of the NHRDN which will certainly benefit the state's youth, he said while informing that the 6 lakh youth had so far registered on this portal. Outlining the importance of creating employment through job fairs, the Chief Minister said that only recently, a three-day extensive job fair was held in the state capital in which more than 1800 applicants were picked up by 36 companies.

Yogi ji also pointed out that prime minister Mr. Narendra Modi has given priority to skill development and has create a separate ministry for it, of which the state government will take utmost benefit. Questioning the quality and standard of education at engineering, polytechnic and ITI institutes in the state, Yogi ji said pass outs here get diplomas but rarely get jobs.

Due to lack of credibility most such institutions have started closing down he said while informing that many engineering institutes had sought permission to stop teaching in the present academic session but the state government turned down the request. He expressed happiness that in line of the state government's wishes, this year, these institutes will help in training over 10 lakh youth.

The Chief Minister also assured all help and cooperation to industrial houses interested in running these ITI's and polytechnics in the state. Referring to the new industrial investment and employment encouragement

policy, he further said that the state government had sent proposals to the central government to simplify labour laws and make them more practical.

He cited the example of Kanpur and West Bengal where unnecessary trade union interference led to closure of many major industries. Yogi ji also pointed out that interests of the industry and labourers was inter-related. He also discussed about conventional industries and said that the state was working on the policy of one district-one product to give a separate identity to every district.

He also assured that the Avadh Shilp Gram in the state capital would be made an innovation centre and rued that this was built without much thought going into the utility of the project. It is therefore not much of creative use, he pointed out while adding that the present state government was committed to better use of infrastructure facilities.

Earlier, Deputy Chief Minister Dr. Dinesh Sharma said Uttar Pradesh played a pivotal role in defining the direction and condition of nation's politics. He added that establishing skill development universities and campus placement cells in all varsities will be taken forward.

Labour and employment minister Mr. Swamy Prasad Maurya said that due to efforts made to improve law and order and efforts being made to benefit all sections of the society, UP had become a favourite destination for industrialists.

MoS (Labour and Employment) Mr. Manohar Lal (Mannu Kori), Additional Chief Secretary (Labour and Employment) Mr. Rajendra Kumar Tiwari, NHRDN Director General Mr. Dhananjay Singh, Padma Shri Dr. Pritam Singh, Chief Mentor of Maruti Suzuki Mr. SY Siddiqui and director employment Mr. Rajendra Prasad also expressed their views on the occasion. A large number of industrialists, youngsters and students were also present at the event.
