Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath Ji has reiterated that lockdown should be followed strictly with special focus to maintain social distancing. He said while the police patrolling should be intensified, it has to be ensured that only health, sanitation workers and home delivery persons go to hotspot areas. "All the houses in the hotspot areas should be sanitised," he said at a high-level lockdown review meeting in Lok Bhawan on Tuesday.

The Chief Minister said that the aspirant preparing for competitive examinations being sent back to their respective homes from Prayagraj, should go through health check up. He directed to send senior administrative, police and health officials to Varanasi, Hapur, Rampur, Aligarh and Muzaffarnagar districts. He also directed to prepare an action plan for various activities in Green Zone and Orange Zone while the Self Help Groups (SHGs) of women should be engaged in the production of masks etc.

The Chief Minister said that each district should ensure arrangement of quarantine centres and shelter homes of the capacity of 15,000—25,000 persons. Also, those who have completed 14-day institutional quarantine should be sent back home. He instructed the officials to use pool testing and random testing for medical testing. Directing to geo-tag shelter homes, he asked the DMs and CMOs to inspect L-1, L-2 and L-3 Covid hospitals, quarantine centres and shelter homes and keep an eye on the quality of fooding and lodging there.

The Chief Minister also directed to maintain oxygen supply in L-1 and L-2 hospitals. He said the number of L-1 Covid hospitals should be increased while number of beds in L-3 hospitals needed to be augmented. He said all the hospitals should be equipped with adequate number of PPE kits and N-95 masks. He directed to ramp up testing capacity and said all the labs should have pool testing facilities. He said the persons taking samples should be trained as per the Covid protocol while in order to increasing testing facilities, the import of global technology should be considered. The CM also stressed the need of using plasma therapy for treatment of Covid patients.

The Chief Minister said that every chain of Corona infection has to be broken. The health workers should be trained to prevent medical infection. He also directed to ensure proper disposal of bio-medical waste. The CM also asked the CMOs to have meeting with nursing home owners and other doctors at district level to speed up tele-consultation to patients and

others. The list of names and telephone numbers of the doctors should be publicised widely so that people may avail the facility.

He said the hay stock is in plenty these days hence the 'Hay Stock Bank' should be set up at cow shelter homes in view of stray cattle and cows. He directed to prepare an action plan as to how to resume industrial units after 3rd May, 2020. Also an action plan should be prepared for employment to migrant labourers arriving from different states, he said. The CM also directed that if a destitute person dies, his or her last rites will be performed by the administration as per approved financial norms.
