Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath Ji has directed to take up contact tracing for Covid protection in an intensified manner. He said more teams for contact tracing may be inducted if required.

Presiding over a high-level unlock review meeting at Lok Bhawan on Monday, he directed the Drug Controller to ensure all necessary medicines are available in all the Covid hospitals and medical institutes. There should be proper backup of the medicines supply. Also there should be no hoarding of the medicines and if it happens the guilty must be punished.

The CM said that oxygen plants should supply the oxygen in the medical colleges on the prescribed rates. He directed to take stringent action in case of black

marketing of the oxygen. There should be no shortage of oxygen in any of the hospitals.

He further directed that all the medical colleges and hospitals of Lucknow, Kanpur Nagar, Prayagraj, Gorakhpur, Varanasi and Meerut should function with full capacity and quality. He said the Drug Controller should ensure proper supply of medicines and oxygen in the hospitals and send the report to the Chief Minister Office on a daily basis.

The CM asked to conduct training programmes regularly to ensure adequate availability of doctors and paramedic in the various hospitals. He also asked to increase the number of beds in the Covid Hospital under the Health department. He said that there should be 1000 I.C.U. beds in SGPGI, RML Institute of Medical Sciences and KGMU.

He said that the mass awareness programmes shall remain continued about protection and safety from the Covid-19. He asked the local bodies to make arrangements of the public address systems through which the people can be addressed and spoken to about Covid protection measures.

The Chief Minister asked to ensure effective implementation of Atmanirbhar Bharat Package. He said all the departments should prepare action plans for its effective implementation so that their benefits of the package reach the state.

He asked to expedite construction of Community Toilets and Panchayat Bhawans in Gram Panchayats. He directed the digging of the pits to prepare compost as part of solid waste management. It will serve the dual purpose of getting quality fertilizer as well as disposal of waste.
